

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT
BETWEEN
THE REGENTS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF MINNESOTA
ON BEHALF OF COLLEGE OF EDUCATION + HUMAN DEVELOPMENT
AT TWINCITIES CAMPUS
AND
SEOUL NATIONAL UNIVERSITY OF EDUCATION

The Regents of the University of Minnesota and Seoul National University of Education, wishing to strengthen their academic and scholarly links and cooperation between faculty and students of both institutions agree as follows:

PURPOSE OF THE AGREEMENT

The purpose of this agreement is to establish cooperative academic relationships between the two institutions in areas discussed below.

SCOPE OF THE AGREEMENT

The parties agree to undertake good faith efforts and discussions with the goal of establishing academic and scholarly cooperative projects that are of mutual interest to colleges, departments and students of each institution.

GENERAL AREAS OF COOPERATION

Subject to the availability of funds and the approval of the interested parties of both institutions, the institutions shall endeavor to develop plans which would include the following areas of cooperation:

- a) Short programs and exchanges
- b) Collaborative degree programs

The parties agree that as an essential proposition to any cooperative endeavor, all participants in programs created pursuant to this agreement will be selected with full respect for equal opportunity for all persons in accordance with the policies of each party and without regard to the race, sex, age, national origin or religious affiliation of participants or candidates for participation.

FINANCIAL ARRANGEMENTS

Both institutions agree that all specific financial arrangements are to be negotiated separately for each component and are dependent on mutual interest and on the availability of funds.

ADMINISTRATION

The terms and necessary budget for each program and activity that is implemented under the terms of this general agreement shall be mutually discussed and agreed upon in writing by both parties prior to the initiation of the particular program or activity. Such work protocols shall be negotiated on an annual basis.

Each institution will designate a contact person to develop and coordinate specific activities or programs.

DURATION OF THE AGREEMENT

This agreement will be effective from the date of signature for an initial period of three years. Thereafter, it will be renegotiated for three-year periods, subject to revision or modification by mutual written agreement. Either party, by written notice to the other party no less than three months prior to the end of any such year period, may terminate this agreement at the end of the current year period.

Appendix A: Workscope and Collaboration Plan for 2010-2013

Areas of Possible Collaboration

Establish 3.5+2 Bachelor – Master program between CEHD and SNUE (these programs are designed to provide a bridge for SNUE students from Bachelor programs at SNUE to Master programs at UM). SNUE students will meet all academic requirements of M.Ed. programs.

Establish Global Teacher Education program

2010 Objectives

- 1) Establish agreement to collaborate via Memorandum of Understanding
- 2) Collaboratively plan Global Teacher Education program
- 3) SNUE identifies program areas of interest for possible collaborative degree programs. The focus of collaboration will be CEHD M.Ed. programs. All programs are eligible to participate in this agreement, but specific program areas will be collaboratively selected on the basis of appropriateness for both universities, and each university may request to exclude particular program areas without penalty.

2011 Objectives

- 1) U of M host first Global Teacher Education program (full details and proposal to be developed and approved by contract and legal offices of both universities)
- 2) CEHD conducts feasibility study of possible collaborative degree programs identified by SNUE
- 3) CEHD prepares for arrival of first cohort of collaborative students

Objectives

- 1) If feasible and amenable to both universities, first cohort of collaborative degree program students arrives in U.S.
